Your letter regarding investments in companies linked to the Myanmar military junta

Dear Ms. Greep and Mr. Brightwell,

We thank you for your letter dated October 19, 2021 to Credit Suisse AG regarding investments in companies linked to the Myanmar military junta. The letter makes reference to a corresponding Bank-track / Justice for Myanmar report published in July 2021.

Credit Suisse is committed to respecting human rights. In our role as an employer and as a user and provider of services, we seek to respect human rights as a key element of conducting business responsibly. Reputational, sustainability and climate issues are all considered as an integral part of our risk review process. These three areas are often not mutually exclusive, and are considered essential to obtain a full client risk picture, alongside other key areas including credit and compliance risk.

Wherever it does business, Credit Suisse works with regulators internationally to ensure compliance with sanctions. Moreover, Credit Suisse prevents its clients from purchasing securities of companies on the sanctions list of the authorities that we follow.
