RE: PETITION FROM HUMAN RIGHTS DEFENDERS (HRDs) AND THE OIL AFFECTED COMMUNITIES AGAINST HARASSMENT AND INTIMIDATION BY SECURITY AGENCIES IN THE DISTRICTS OF BULLISA AND HOIMA

Introduction

This petition presents the previous and current human rights violations of the HRDs and oil-affected communities in Hoima and Buliisa districts.

Like many other HRDs who speak out against oil-related issues, the Oil and gas Region Human Rights Defenders Association (ORGHA) members have repeatedly been threatened and intimidated. In recent weeks, some have received anonymous threatening phone calls. Civil society and affected communities have been unable to meet and speak freely about the impacts of oil projects which is against their constitutional right assembly. This is unacceptable. Moreover, this type of response by the Ugandan authorities sends a chilling message to all those who may attempt to assert their rights or defend the rights of others, thereby contributing to the destruction of civic space in Uganda

Human and Environmental rights activists under the "Oil and Gas Human Rights Defenders Association" (ORGHA) consider the increasing harassment by law enforcement officers to be illegal and baseless as some of the ORGHA members have been arrested and others forced to abandon their work. The activists are concerned that the Resident District Commissioner (RDC), DISO, and Police disband their gatherings/meetings for unjustified reasons hence the disproportionate restriction to their freedom of assembly and their freedom of expression.

Below are some incidents of intimidation and harassment which have been faced by HRDs in Buliisa in the year 2021, Unfortunately, we anticipate there will be more in 2022 as mentioned below;

 On 7th October 2021, the RDC, DISO, District Community Development Office (DCDO), and Police officials in Buliisa district closed the ORGHA contact office hosted by the Africa Institute for Energy Governance (AFIEGO) and Navigators of Development Association (NAVODA) and stopped meetings organised by ORGHA to sensitize Project affected Persons (PAPs) in the Albertine region on how to demand fair, prompt and timely compensation. ORGHA activists' battle with multinational companies and their subcontractors, some greedy local and National authorities, and corrupt officials in matters of land grabbing and inadequate and delayed compensation when they attempt to defend vulnerable groups such as poor project affected persons, children, and women.

- On 25th May 2021 an ORGHA member, Mr. Maxwell Atuhura was arrested at Adonia Hotel Buliisa Town by Police on orders of RDC and DISO Buliisa district. He spent more than 48 hours in cells in Buliisa and Hoima Central police stations and he was released on police bond and charged for unlawful assembly (Ref: BULIISA GEF/04/2021). To date, the police still have some of his belongings like two phones, a field camera, recorder, diary, class notes, and some documents of his work. Furthermore, the regional CID sitting at Hoima Regional police station asked Maxwell to write a letter asking for his property, which he did however, he has never received his property
- On 7th October ORGHA's certificate of registration, constitution, minutes, board resolutions, and other papers in a file were forcefully confiscated by the DCDO for reasons unknown to members. When the chairperson, ORGHA followed up on the issue, the DCDO revealed to him that the file was given to the RDC.

Thereafter Mr. Jos Mugisa the chairperson of ORGHA was arrested on October 14, 2021, when he was accused of violence and verbal abuse within his family. He was then remanded to Masindi prison until November 10, 2021.

- The signposts of ORGHA's partners AFIEGO and NAVODA were vandalized and taken to an unknown place on 19th October 2021. According to neighbors, armed men came at around 11 pm in the night and ordered everybody to enter their houses, and the following day, the signposts were missing. This incident happened one week after the DCDO had informed one ORGHA member to have the signposts removed or else, they would use force on orders of the RDC. We reported the theft of those signposts to Buliisa Central police (SD REF: 21/19/10/2021) but no follow-up was done by the police. Something happened for the second time. Secondly, Mr. Maxwell's house was broken into by unknown people who made away with school items. He reported the case to the same police station under reference number (SD 34/24/05/2021) but nothing was done.
- Some HRDs have to report the police station for endless police bonds. For instance, Mr. Maxwell Atuhura reports on police bonds since 27th May 2021. We believe security agencies are working to continuously intimidate and harass HRDs so they are unable to protect the rights of communities as well as protect the environment.

On June 2021 many ORGHA members were summoned under unclear circumstances to Buliisa Central police station over meeting PAPs in their villages. Among those summoned through a phone call to make statements, included Mr. Onen Charles, Ms. Judith, and Mr. Geoffrey.

Our Demands

ORGHA and her partners, we demand the following;

- Baseless cases on ORGHA members should be dropped as they seem to be merely aimed at punishing them for their human rights activities.
- Open our partners' office in Buliisa with immediate effect.
- · The Police should return Mr. Maxwell's property that was confiscated during his arrest.
- Illegal verbal orders from the RDC must stop. Let all communication be clearly written.
- The security agencies in Buliisa should stop unnecessary arrests and interference in ORGHA's work.
- Cease any further harassment of ORGHA, AFIEGO, NAVODA, and other CSOs in Uganda.
- A public apology by police should be issued to the victims of this harassment and their families.
- Guarantee in all circumstances the physical integrity and psychological well-being of ORGHA members as well as all human rights defenders in Uganda.
- Put an end to any form of surveillance, intimidation, and harassment, including judicial harassment against HRDs in Uganda.
- Concrete actions should be taken to stop the repeated attacks on HRDs and journalists.

Conclusion

We thank you and your office for the good work towards the protection of human rights in the country. As ORGHA members, we hope that our demands in this petition are addressed with post and haste.
